The book's vivid portrait of the dangers and allures of a life chasing fish on the high seas won over this year's judges. Released in 2008, "Red Sky Morning" is a true-life coming-of-age tale set amidst California's daring seafaring culture of the 1960's. It relives the summer Rafkin turned 17, when he joins up with his father, the San Pedro-based captain of a large purse seiner, on a tuna run off the East Coast of the U.S. As Rafkin soon discovers, it's a lifestyle filled with partying, girls, and back-breaking labor – along with the danger of being washed overboard at almost any time. All of which he takes to like a fish to water.

Two years later, Rafkin joins the crew of a ninety-foot fishing boat, the Diana, for a four-day trip off the Santa Barbara coast. But what's supposed to be a run-of-the-mill expedition turns into the scariest day of Rafkin's life as the crew encounters a freak hurricane-force storm. In the 24 hours that follow, they'll fight with every force of their being to keep control of their ship – and one of them won't survive.

But "Red Sky Morning" is more than action and adventure. Through it all, readers will meet a memorable cast of characters who populate and humanize this forbidding world, shedding light on one of the least-understood industries.
